ADAPT: Higher education and research

- Founded in 2000 by Marco Biagi, Professor of Law killed by left-wing terrorists in 2002, to promote, in an international and comparative perspective, studies and research in the field of industrial relations and employment.
- ADAPT also promotes a **new approach to academic research**, through ongoing relationships and exchanges between higher education institutions, associations, trade unions and businesses.
- In this sense, it is worth mentioning:
 - the **International PhD School in Human Capital Formation and Labour Relations**, in agreement with the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research and the University of Bergamo.
 - the **School of Higher Education in Labour and Industrial Relations**, in collaboration with the Centre for International and Comparative Studies DEAL at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia.
- Since 2007, the ADAPT School of Higher Education funded through membership fees and partnership agreements with companies, employers' associations, trade unions and institutions: • 315 three-year private PhD scholarships; • 118 apprenticeship contracts for higher education and research; Since 2003 • 71 one-year research grants at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia and at the University of Bergamo; • 33 private scholarships for higher education programmes; • 16 editions of the Marco Biagi awards (ADAPT – Ministry of Labour and Social Policies) for the best Master's or PhD thesis.

Among the European projects ongoing: Bargaining for Productivity; SUNI (Smart Unions for New Industry); EuroDuale (European cooperative framework for Dual Learning); Woodual (Wood sector and dual learning for youth employment and skills); AgreeNment (A green mentality for collective bargaining); ASPIRE (Active ageing through social partnership and industrial relations in Europe); etc.

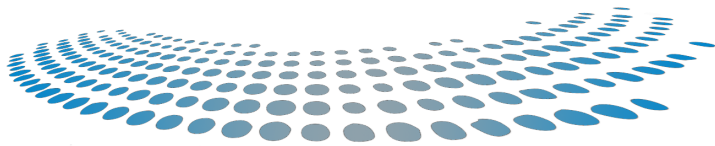
